

With our approval process complete, the MPOAC respectively submits the attached list of 37 projects (representing 17 MPOs and seven (7) FDOT Districts) to FDOT. We request that the Department review and consider these priorities during the annual update to FDOT's Five-Year Work Program across all relevant funding programs (e.g., NHFP, SIS, District Discretionary). The list is organized by FDOT District and then alphabetically by MPO name. In addition, a summary sheet is attached to share program highlights for this year's submissions.

We intend to reach out to your staff over the next few months to identify any priority projects the Department was able to advance and discuss ways we can improve the list for 2024.

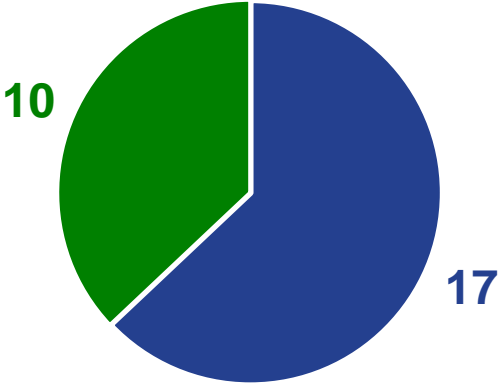

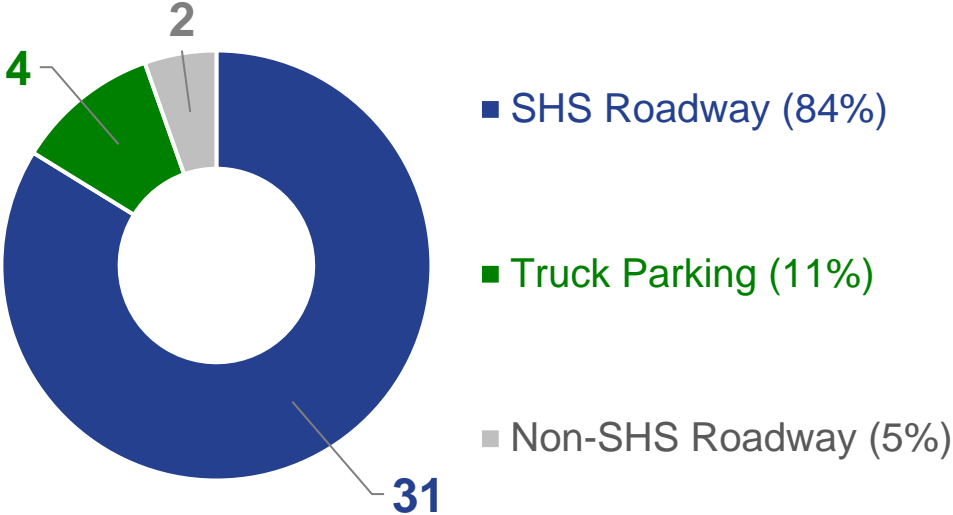

## Project Categories Submitted



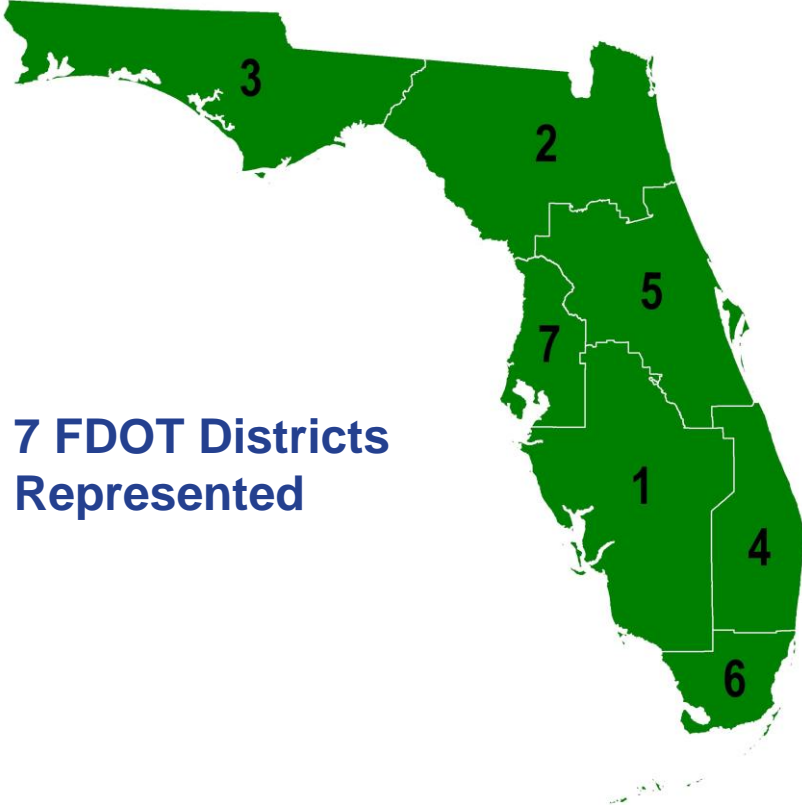
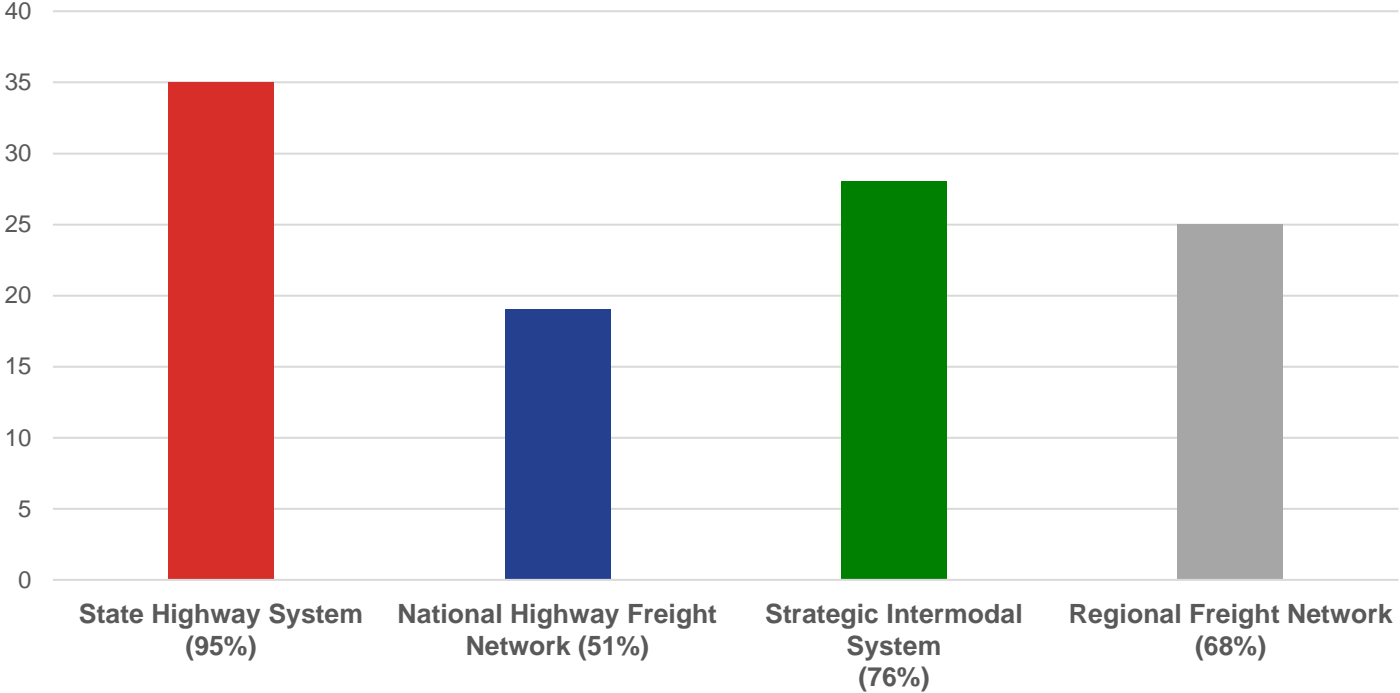

## 2023 Freight Priorities Program

---

### Program Overview

The Metropolitan Planning Organization Advisory Council (MPOAC) Freight & Rail Committee developed the Freight Priorities Program (FPP) to identify and promote high-priority freight projects within the planning boundaries of Florida's Metropolitan Planning Organizations<sup>1</sup> for consideration in FDOT's 5-Year Work Program and other potential funding sources. The FPP's objective is to collaboratively develop a comprehensive list of projects representing the unified input of the MPOAC. The MPOAC updates and endorses the FPP's project list annually.

### Project Selection Overview

The FPP Project List contains all project submissions that passed the agreed-upon requirements set by the Freight & Rail Committee. Eligible projects include state highway system (SHS) roadway, non-SHS roadway, truck parking, intermodal logistic center access, and rail projects. MPOs submit project applications through an online application portal. The application review process vets each project for program eligibility and level of readiness for advanced phase (e.g., design, ROW, construction) funding. The 2023 Program's critical activities included:

1. Training webinars were conducted virtually on February 22<sup>nd</sup> and March 1<sup>st</sup>. The training sessions covered project eligibility and application submission demonstrations through the online portal.
2. The project submission period began on March 2<sup>nd</sup> and remained open until March 31<sup>st</sup>. MPOs were permitted to submit up to 3 SHS roadway projects and up to 3 of the other project types for a maximum of 6 submissions.
3. Project submissions were reviewed for completeness through the online system. Requests for additional information were submitted to each MPO, and they were able to make updates to their applications. One-on-one technical assistance was made available to answer specific questions.
4. Projects that met all the program's eligibility requirements were included in the 2023 FPP Project List. The MPOAC's Freight & Rail Committee, Staff Directors' Advisory Committee, and Governing Board reviewed and approved the final list on April 27<sup>th</sup>.

### Summary of 2023 FPP Project List

- 17 of Florida's 27 MPOs submitted 37 projects representing all 7 FDOT Districts.
- 76% of projects include SIS-designated facilities, and 51% include NHFN-designated facilities.
- 95% of projects are also FDOT District Freight Coordinator priorities.
- Funding advancements and requests totaled over \$3.0 billion across 37 projects.
- All projects support at least 3 of 7 Florida Transportation Plan goals, with a majority supporting all 7.
