INTERMODAL LOGISTICS CENTER (ILC) INFRASTRUCTURE SUPPORT PROGRAM

SECTION 311.101, F.S.



The Intermodal Logistics Center Infrastructure Support Program was created within the Florida Department of Transportation for the purpose of providing funds for roads, rail, facilities, or other means of conveyance or shipment of goods through a seaport, enabling the state to respond to private sector market demands and meet the state's economic development goal of becoming a hub for trade, logistics, and export-oriented activities.

The term "intermodal logistics center" includes an "inland port," which means a facility or group of facilities serving as a point of intermodal transfer of freight in a specific area physically separated from a seaport where activities relating to transport, logistics, goods distribution, consolidation, or value-added activities are carried out and whose activities and services are designed to support or be supported by conveyance or shipping through a Florida seaport.

The Department has \$15 million available annually through fiscal year 2029-2030, and can provide up to 50% of the project cost of eligible projects. This program will be administered in collaboration with Florida Commerce.

Department Project Evaluation Criteria:

The Department will consider the following criteria when evaluating projects:

- The ability of the project to serve a strategic state interest.
- The ability of the project to facilitate the cost-effective and efficient movement of goods.
- The extent to which the project contributes to economic activity, including job creation, increased wages, and revenues.
- The extent to which the project efficiently interacts with and supports the transportation network.
- A commitment of a funding match.
- The amount of investment or commitments made by the owner or developer of the existing or proposed facility.
- The extent to which the owner has commitments, including memoranda of understanding or memoranda of agreements, with private sector businesses planning to locate operations at the intermodal logistics center.
- Demonstrated local financial support and commitment to the project.

Open Application Solicitation Cycle

- This program has a rolling application cycle that is open for applicants to apply at any time.
- Submissions are considered for funding in current and future years and will be made up until the closing date of the next tentative work program for any given fiscal year.
- Applications are now being accepted for funding consideration through fiscal year 2029-2030.
